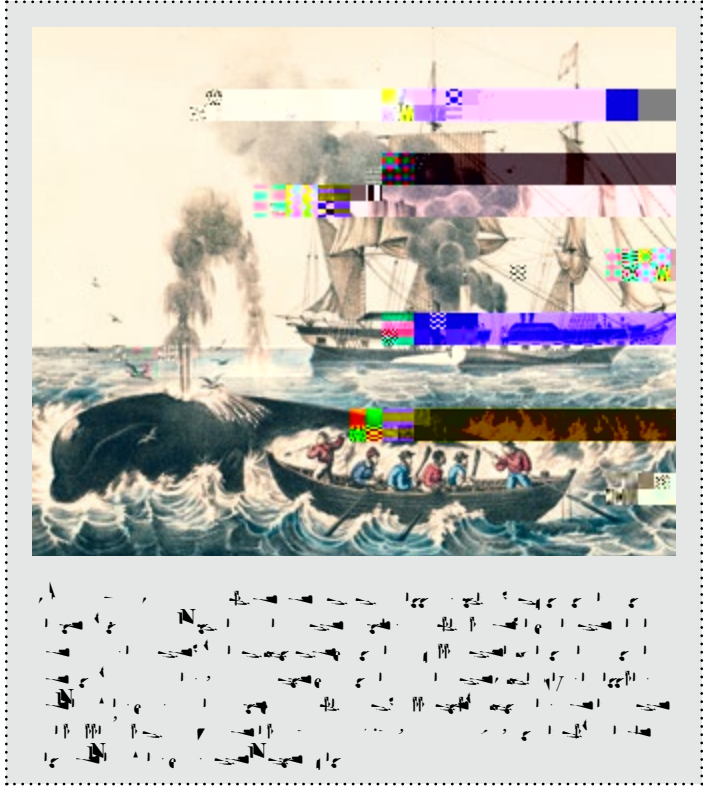


# EARLE REPORT SAYS INDIANS NOT SUITABLE AS CITIZENS

A report by the Indian Affairs Commission, known as the Earle Report, has been published. It states that Indians are not suitable as citizens.
